Present: Mark Denney, Ron Romig, Pastor Nelson, Pastor Snyder, Jean Fluevog, Laura Gray.

President Mark Denney called the meeting to order. Mrs. Gray shared a devotion based on John 9. A motion was made and seconded (Romig/Fluevog) to approve the agenda for the meeting with the addition of Third Quarter Mission Giving under New Business and also the minutes of the February BOD meeting as presented. The motion passed 3-0.

OLD BUSINESS

Time and Talent Survey: Mr. Denney reported the Board of Stewardship is planning to set up easels in the Narthex with information on opportunities for service that parishioners can volunteer to do. They are also considering creating an online version of opportunities for service.

Electronic Messaging Center: Mr. Romig reported he has not heard back from Ann at Young Sign Co. about an estimate for a sign that meets current size requirements. He noted the sign at Frontier Community Credit Union is readable. He will find out the size of it and forward the information to the board.

Pictorial Directory: Pastor Nelson is still working on setting up the pictorial directory and plans to send out information about it via Flocknote.

Security System: Pastor Snyder shared all the smoke detectors are now installed and the system is set up for external monitoring.

BOD MEMBER UPDATES

Pastor Nelson shared he baptized Violet Findeisen on Saturday. The family is interested in Sunday School for the children. He has been following up with visitors in recent weeks. The first communion classes will be completed in two weeks. One student will receive First Communion on Maundy Thursday and the other on April 27. Thursday March 27 he will set up the first Coffee Connect in the parking lot after school for the students and their families.

Pastor Snyder shared he and Pastor Nelson continue to meet on Tuesdays. He feels Pastor Nelson is making great connections with people.

1st Vice President: Mr. Romig shared the financials show a positive balance for both January and February. This is often not the case in the first months of the year. John Lange will provide financials to the boards each month. The reception for the Stillian's went well and they were very appreciative. Mr. Denney shared he received a notice from the IRS concerning Form 945 for the end of tax year 2023. He will ask the accountant to investigate it.

2nd Vice President: Mr. Fluevog reported the Elders approved their goals for 2026. The Boards of Education and Youth did not meet.

3rd Vice President: Absent – no report.

Easter Sunday is April 20. Worship services will be at 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00. The next food drive for Trinity House will be Saturday April 26 at Dillons.

There being no other business, Mr. Romig closed the meeting with prayer.

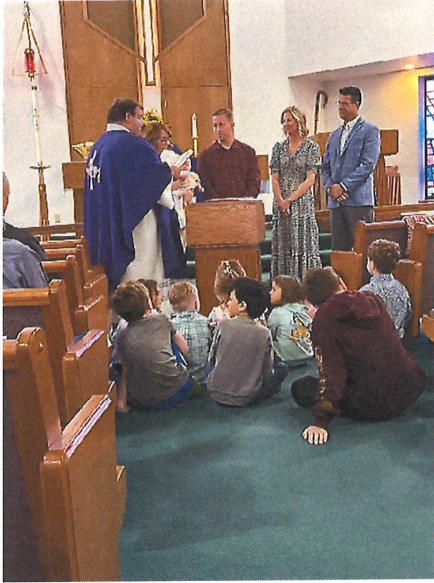

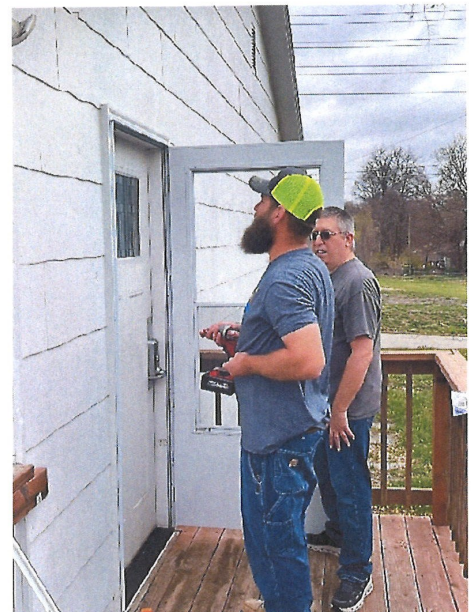
