

## *Pastor's Letter*

Greetings in Christ,

Have you been to a Bible study in a while? Or ever? Do you know what we do in a Bible study? I ask this question because when I was new to the Lutheran church, a friend of mine invited me to a Bible study. This was actually the way that my relationship with the Lutheran church began. I asked him what they did and he told me that they had a book and they took turns answering questions, etc. In my mind, I pictured a large, leather-bound tome with metal hinges and a locking mechanism on it...that was what I thought the "book" was! Let me assure you, our books are nowhere near as menacing as that!

Trinity has a Bible study led by Pastor Nelson at 9:30 am on Sunday mornings. I fill in for him one Sunday per month. Tuesday mornings at 9:45 am features a women's Bible study led by Nadine Roth. I lead a study on Wednesday mornings at 10:00 am that is currently studying applying God's Word to our anxious hearts. I also lead two evening Bible studies (Mon/Weds at 7:00 pm). Both of these are currently on break for Lent, but we are studying the book of Exodus. Finally, Emily and I have a dinner and Bible study for young couples and their kids in our home once or twice a month on Sundays starting at 5 pm. We are finishing up a study about questions to ask when you study the Bible and plan a video study of Israel and the scriptures after that.

We laugh, think, share, and even have snacks sometimes! If you would like to come and feast on God's Word and hear the good news of Christ giving His life on the cross for sinners by joining any of these studies, just reach out to Nathan or myself and we can point you in the right direction.

# President's Letter

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A life-long member of Trinity has inquired about the possibility of Trinity purchasing a columbarium. A columbarium is an above-ground structure of vaults that house cremated remains in urns. The Board of Directors has agreed to gauge the Congregation's interest in housing a columbarium on our property. In the coming weeks, we will put out a brief survey to see whether this is something we should pursue further. Following is some information on columbariums and why it would be a good idea for Trinity to have one.

## **A Columbarium: A Sacred Witness to Hope in Christ**

As Lutherans, we confess that in life and in death we belong to Jesus Christ. When our congregation considers the possibility of a columbarium, we are not simply discussing a building or structure—we are reflecting on how the Church continues to bear witness to Christ's promise of resurrection and new life, even in the face of death.

A columbarium is a sacred, consecrated place for the reverent placement of cremated remains. For our Congregation, it can serve as a meaningful expression of our theology, our pastoral care, and our commitment to one another as the body of Christ.

## **A Place of Comfort Rooted in God's Promises**

Grief is a lifelong journey, and the Church has always played a central role in walking with God's people through loss. A columbarium offers families a peaceful and prayerful place to remember loved ones, reflect on God's Word, and find comfort in the promises made in baptism.

When a columbarium is located at the church, families are reminded that the same place where they heard the gospel, received the sacraments, and were nurtured in faith is also the place where their loved ones are laid to rest. This continuity offers deep reassurance: nothing—not even death—separates us from the love of God in Christ Jesus (Romans 8:38–39).

## **Affirming Lutheran Teaching on Death and Resurrection**

The Lutheran Church affirms both burial and cremation as faithful options, emphasizing reverence for the body and trust in God's promise of resurrection. A columbarium reflects this reverence and clearly proclaims our belief that death does not have the final word.

Situated near the sanctuary or in a memorial garden, a columbarium stands as a visible witness to the resurrection hope we confess each Sunday: *"I believe in the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting."* It reminds all who pass by that those who have died in the Lord rest in God's care, awaiting the fulfillment of Christ's promise.

## **Strengthening the Congregational Family**

For many members, choosing a church columbarium is an expression of deep connection to their congregation. It reflects a desire to remain part of the church community not only in life, but also in death. This sense of belonging is central to the Lutheran understanding of the Church as the gathered people of God.

Over time, a columbarium becomes a record of faith lived out in this place. The names engraved there tell the story of generations who worshiped, served, taught, and trusted in Christ. It becomes a teaching tool for future generations, reminding them that they are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses who lived by grace through faith.

## **Faithful Stewardship for Today's Needs**

As cremation becomes increasingly common, a columbarium offers a thoughtful, accessible option for families seeking a Christian setting for final committal. It is often more affordable than traditional burial and easier for loved ones to visit, especially when the church remains a central gathering place.

Designed with care, a columbarium can be a beautiful and peaceful addition to church property—a place for prayer, quiet reflection, and remembrance. It supports the congregation's ministry while making wise use of space and resources.

## **An Extension of Pastoral Care**

Ultimately, a columbarium is an extension of the Church's calling to proclaim the gospel in every season of life. It says to members and their families: *You are held in God's grace, surrounded by this community, and entrusted to Christ—now and forever.*

As Lutherans, we live with confidence in God's promise that death is not the end. A columbarium bears gentle, faithful witness to that truth, offering comfort to the grieving, hope to the living, and glory to the risen Christ.

Bob Summers and I met with a parishioner from St. Paul Episcopal and learned about their columbarium, which they have had for 17 years. I invite you to stop by their Church – located at the corner of 7th Street and Seneca – and take a look.

Please take time to research this topic and participate in the survey—we want your feedback! In that survey, we will provide a budget for the purchase and installation of the structure, as well as pricing for the niches.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 27, 2026

Meeting Minutes

Present: Pastor Nelson, Pastor Snyder, Jeff Thorne, Ron Romig, Jean Fluevog, John Lange, Mark Denney, Rod Low, Laura Gray

Mr. Denney called the meeting to order and shared a devotion based on Luke 10:2. A motion was made and seconded (Thorne/Romig) to approve the agenda for the meeting as printed. Motion passed 4-0.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

**BOD actions since the last meeting:** In email votes the BOD approved 1) the minutes of the November 2025 BOD meeting, 2) Tiffany Battle as Board of Education chair, and 3) modifications to the sidewalks and parking lot as recommended by the Board of Properties.

**Electronic Message Center:** The EMC is functioning and several members have been trained in its use. All messages will be approved by Pastor Snyder and then go to Kathleen Adams to be added to the EMC. She has done a good job adding several slides already. It was noted that the temperature reading is not correct. John Gray will talk to DAK Electronics about the problem. The previously approved brickwork will be completed in the next few months as weather permits.

**Pictorial Directory:** Pastor Nelson reported printing the Pictorial Directory did not work. Other paper has been ordered. He will add the month and year to the front of the directory.

**Columbarium:** Mr. Denney will talk with Bob Summers and create a questionnaire to assess the congregation's interest in a columbarium at Trinity. He will also get some background information and investigate costs. Pastor Snyder suggested locating the columbarium in a place more visible than the prayer garden, so that people can see it on Sundays.

## **BOD MEMBER UPDATES**

Pastor Snyder and Pastor Nelson did not have any further updates.

**1<sup>st</sup> Vice President:** Mr. Romig shared Trinity received an undesignated gift of \$25,000 from a member in December. In addition, \$9800 in gifts were received for Trinity House in December. These gifts resulted in a \$57,000 surplus for the year. The Board of Properties approved the modifications to the sidewalks.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President:** Nothing to report

**3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President:** Mr. Fluevog shared Tiffany Battle led her first Board of Education meeting and it went well.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

**Trinity House:** Rod Low shared the Board of Stewardship's concern about the money given to Trinity House in 2025 that has not yet been spent and their recommendation to move the money given in 2025 and designated for Trinity House that is now in General Reserves to the Trinity House Reserve. A motion was made and seconded (Denney/Thorne) to move the \$18,563 given in 2025 and designated for Trinity House in General Reserves to the Trinity House Reserve so that the Board of Social Concerns is better able to track the funds available. The motion passed unanimously. The BOD also discussed the possibility of separating Trinity House into its own board. No action was taken.

**Bundles of Joy:** Mrs. Gray requested input as to which board the Bundles of Joy ministry should fall under. The consensus was to put it under Board of Fellowship. Mrs. Gray will discuss this with the board chair, Kathy Rush.

**Voters' Meeting Dates:** The 2026 Voters' Meetings dates were set for May 31, 2026, and November 15, 2026. The May meeting falls on the 5th Sunday so there will be one service at 9:30. The Board of Worship will decide on the menu for a meal following the service. The voters' meeting will follow the meal.

# *Board of Directors cont.*

**Synod President Election:** Each congregation has one pastoral vote and one lay member vote in the election of the Synod President this summer. A motion was made and seconded (Fluevog/Thorne) to appoint Pastor Snyder as the pastoral delegate and Kathy Rush as the lay delegate for Trinity. The motion passed unanimously. Pastor Snyder will register Trinity's voting delegates online.

**Polling Location:** Members agreed that Trinity would continue serving as a polling place for Leavenworth County elections. Mr. Denney will sign the paperwork and send it in. Someone will need to open the building by 6:00a.m. on election days.

**Upcoming Events:** Ash Wednesday is February 18th. There will be one service at 7:00 pm. Weekly Lenten services will be held February 25, March 4, 11, 18, and 25 at 7:00 pm. A light meal will be served before the service and cookies after.

The American Red Cross will hold a blood drive at Trinity on February 26.

There being no other business, Pastor Snyder closed the meeting with prayer.
