



Pastor's Letter

Greetings in Christ,

July is the time when, in this country, we celebrate the many freedoms afforded to us by our Constitution and Bill of Rights. These are freedoms that we say come from God and not from man. The Word of God also speaks about freedom that comes from God. In fact, it says that it is, "for freedom that Christ has set us free" (Gal. 5:1a, ESV). The question is, what does this mean? For many in our world today, freedom means being able to do what I want, when I want, and how I want. It does not ask about the effect my actions have on my neighbor, nor what God thinks about my actions. It is purely "me" focused.

The freedom that God grants us in Galatians 5:1a comes from the life and death of Jesus Christ as He sacrificed Himself for us. He willingly laid down his life so that we could be set free from the trap of sin which always leads to death. By atoning for our sins, Jesus made it so that we do not have to worry about judgment day. Our debt is paid. Our sins forgiven.

This freedom from fear of judgment, however, is not intended to send the message that it doesn't matter what we do. Far from it! If we continue reading in Galatians, we find, "stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery" (Galatians 5:1b). Sin is tricky and it easily traps us all in the name of exercising our freedom. It turns us in on ourselves and has us ask the question of what I want to get out of MY freedom. In the context of Galatians, the trick being played by sin was to get people to think that Christ was not enough to save them...they needed something more. Something like circumcision, or following the dietary laws. Instead of being turned in on ourselves, let us, by the power of God's Holy Spirit, be turned outward towards our neighbor and ask how I can use my freedom, the freedom of the Gospel, to serve him. In so doing we really are exercising freedom from the fear of judgment that is granted us by the death of Christ and are standing firm in such faith.

Associate Pastor's Letter

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Recently in our church, we have been doing something different for those who have been seriously struggling with different illnesses. This “something different” has been a ceremony of anointing. Even though this has only been performed a couple of times, this has still raised some important theological questions that I feel like should be answered. Maybe you weren't even aware that this was something being performed at Trinity or that it was something that *could* be done at all.

Admittedly, I was not too familiar with the ceremony of anointing before being called to serve here at Trinity. I knew that there was a ceremony for it in our Lutheran Agenda (the big pastor hymnals with all of the “bonus” services), but quite frankly, I'd always blown it off as a Catholic thing. However, anointing is not just some Catholic thing. It is actually a Biblical thing.

In James 5:13-16, we read: “Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise. Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith will save the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working.”

There is a lot to unpack in this passage, but there is a clear path laid out for something that Christians can do in response to illness. Those who are sick can reach out to the church elders and let them pray over them and be anointed with oil. Prayer is the obvious part that we should be used to. We encourage prayer at all times, and we even encourage all at Trinity who are in need of prayer to turn in the blue cards during worship so that we can pray for them as God's church. But why the anointing with oil?

Well, throughout the Old Testament, anointing with oil was a sign of God's favor, usually for God's prophets, priests, and kings. As just one example, in 1 Kings 19, God commands his prophet Elijah to anoint Jehu to be Israel's king and to anoint Elisha to be the next prophet to come after Elijah. Oil had many uses in ancient days, but anointing with oil was significant for the oil's cleansing properties. When a prophet, priest, or king was being anointed, it was a sign of God's favor and cleansing them for the task.

If we take this Old Testament theology and apply it to our New Testament perspective as Christians, we know that we have ultimately one Prophet, one Priest, and one King—Christ Jesus. Hebrews 4:14 describes Jesus in this way: “Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession.” And, because we are all brought into the faith and the church through Christ, we are also made to be priests with Christ. 1 Peter 2:9 says, “But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.” To us as Christian, when we anoint someone with oil, we remind them of this reality—that they are a part of the priesthood of all believers in Jesus Christ.

On its own, the oil does nothing other than to act as a reminder of this Christian reality. Unlike Baptism or the Lord's Supper, this act is not a sacrament. It does not deliver God's gifts and promises to His people, but anointing does remind His people of His gifts and promises. This ceremony of anointing is meant to remind a sick person of two things: (1) They are a part of the priesthood of all believers and an heir to the kingdom of heaven; and (2) that Christ has accomplished their eternal healing and they will be resurrected to perfect, imperishable bodies on the last day.

As part of this ceremony, we are also told in James that the elders of the church are to be present in order to pray over this person. This shows the church of God gathering together as one in Christ to pray for the ailing person. The oil and the prayer are not expected to bring about any sort of miracle. Healing and miracles are always within God's power to perform, but we cannot force God's hand by performing any sort of ceremony. But God has commanded that we pray for those in need, and this ceremony of anointing is one such way for us to do this.

If you or anyone you know is sick or wanting prayer before a surgery or any similar struggle, know that this ceremony of anointing is something that I or Pastor Damian are able to perform in the presence of our church's elders. This can be done as part of one of our Sunday services if you would want it to be public, or it can be done during one of our elders meetings if you would prefer it to be private, but if we are to follow what Scripture says about anointing, church elders should be present for it. If you desire your church family to pray for you, please always let us know. If you feel like you are in need of some encouragement along with that prayer, know that this ceremony of anointing is available to you as well. If you have further questions about this or anything else, feel free to reach out to me as always.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We recently sang one of my favorite hymns during worship – “Hark the Voice of Jesus Crying”. This familiar hymn asks, “Who will go and work today?” and reminds us that Christ calls every believer to serve according to the gifts He has given. As we look ahead to 2027 at the ministry opportunities at Trinity, each Board seeks to answer that call in unique and meaningful ways—caring for members, strengthening worship, fostering fellowship, reaching our community, nurturing youth, supporting those in need, growing in Christian education, encouraging faithful stewardship, and maintaining the facilities that support our mission. Together, we are Christ's hands and feet, sharing His love and proclaiming His Gospel. At the May 31st Voters Meeting, we approved the 2027 Board Ministry Objectives. I invite you to carefully read through each board's goals and choose an area that you are interested in serving. My prayer is that you hear His voice and joyfully respond, “Here am I, send me.”

Board of Elders:

The Board of Elders will support the pastoral staff of Trinity and assist in ministering to the Congregation. We will monitor the worship attendance of participants and reach out to those participants (via phone, email, text or personal visit) who had been attending worship but had been absent for an extended period. We will also be available to support the special needs of the families.

Board of Worship:

Offer opportunities to encourage worship.
Continue strong volunteer support for worship services.
Increase involvement of children and youth in worship.
Expand music ministries to the local community.

Board of Fellowship:

We will provide fellowship opportunities within the church and the community to encourage and enhance Christian relationships.
We will provide fellowship opportunities in support of worship services.
We will provide fellowship opportunities in support of Trinity's ministry.
We will provide childcare for worship and other Church activities when needed.
We will provide notes of Christian fellowship and encouragement to newborns and their parents for Bundles of Joy.

Board of Outreach:

Conduct activities in the greater Leavenworth area that share God's Word with those not associated with Trinity Lutheran Church.
Encourage members of Trinity to participate in outreach activities.
Conduct the visitor welcome and follow-up program.

Board of Youth:

Work with the associate pastor regarding youth and youth programs.
Increase the attendance and involvement of youth at youth group.

Board of Social Concerns:

Provide spiritual, emotional, and physical support to our congregational members and to those in our local community.

Board of Education:

Continue to strengthen the library by increasing the number of Christian resources to enhance spiritual growth for everyone and support the Christian educational program of the church. Place particular emphasis on improving and increasing materials for children and teens.

Continue to support, expand, and improve on the quality of specific ongoing educational ministries. Invite an annual speaker (around Education Sunday) who would present a topic of current need/interest to our congregation.

Increase attendance at Sunday School, Children's Church, Faith Legacy, Youth Classes including Confirmation, Adult Bible Classes, small groups, and retreats. Working with church leadership, formulate ideas to attract younger families into the church, coordinate with Youth Group leaders to find ways to improve the classes and services provided for our youth, and announce to church members when new classes and Bible studies are about to start. Continue to promote and strengthen our VBS program.

Increase the number of people providing and supporting Trinity's educational services.

Have at least one Board of Education member attend outreach opportunities such as PAIR Day to hand out materials about VBS, current Bible studies, classes, and small groups.

Board of Stewardship:

Nurture youth and children in developing an appreciation of all the gifts God has provided (Time, Talents, and Treasure) while considering types of responses back to God.

Educate Trinity members concerning a Christian Lifestyle which involves growing in faith and a relationship with Christ through stewardship of God's gifts (Time, Talent, and Treasure).

Conduct annual updates with the Involvement Survey (or other method) by members to discover their many gifts from God so they can find their niche among the many Trinity ministries.

On a semi-annual basis, communicate to the members, through multiple channels, how the Board of Stewardship is using their gifts and where we have shortfalls, so they better understand the financial stability of the Church.

Board of Properties:

Recruit new and younger members to serve with the board.

Maintain and improve the inside and outside of the church.

Assist in expanding the ministry facilities.

OLD BUSINESS

In an email vote the BOD approved the minutes of the April BOD meeting.

Trinity Times Distribution: A notice has been placed in the Trinity Times and the Sunday bulletin asking members who desire to continue receiving a printed copy of the Trinity Times to sign up in the Welcome Center or the church office. To date several families have opted to continue receiving the printed copy. The cost for mailing the 200 copies that have been sent out is about \$60.00 per month plus the annual permit fee of \$300.00. No decision has been made about the distribution method to give time for more people to sign up if they wish to receive the printed copy.

BOD MEMBER UPDATES

Staff: Pastor Snyder shared Ute Abel is now at Twin Oaks after a fall in her home. Pastor Nelson had no report.

1st Vice President: Mr. Romig shared April financials. We ended the month with a deficit of about \$2800.00 and a year-to-date deficit of about \$26,000. Total cash and investments at the end of the month was \$575,241.

2nd Vice President: Absent

3rd Vice President: Mr. Fluevog shared the Bd of Education was very pleased with the Faith Legacy Chest Tom Johnson made. He also shared he had received a couple questions about the Rite of Anointing. Pastor Nelson has included information about the rite and how it can be used to lift up members in his Trinity Times article this month.

NEW BUSINESS

FFF Sunday and Voters' Meeting: Mrs. Bruner and the Board of Worship have everything under control for the brunch following the 9:30 service. The agenda for the Voters' meeting following the meal will include financial updates, reports from board chairs, and a vote on the 2027 Board Objectives.

Upcoming Events: VBS will be July 20-24. About 35 children are registered. A few volunteer positions are still unfilled. Training for volunteers will be conducted June 7 and 28.

Parking Lot: Historically Trinity has resealed the parking lot every two years. The last two times the cost has been about \$10,000. This year Approved Asphalt submitted a bid for \$17,000. Mr. Romig suggested reaching out to McConnell and Associates Asphalt for a second bid. Members also discussed moving to resealing every three years rather than every two years.

There being no other business, Pastor Nelson closed the meeting with prayer.

Book Club

Trinity Book club. Our July book is **The Book Club for Troublesome Women** by Marie Bostwick. By 1960s standards, Margaret is living the American woman's dream. She has a husband, three children, a station wagon, and a home in an exclusive suburb. On paper, she has it all. So why doesn't that feel like enough? To add something more to her life, Margaret concocts a book club and invites three other neighborhood women. As the women share secrets, cocktails, and their reactions to the controversial **The Feminine Mystique**, they discover that the American dream they'd been sold isn't all roses - and that they all share a secret longing for something more.
